MINUTES OF GREAT EASTON VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE MEETING

Held 25th JANUARY 2023 AT 10.00AM

1. Welcome and Apologies - Happy New Year

2. Matters Arising:

Garden Update: Neighbouring Tree (TS)

John Boulter is currently on holiday in NZ so Tim has been unable to follow up.

Tim will follow up with him when he returns, to see if he can assist with some pruning of the tree that affects the neighbouring property (c/f)

(NB Bob Mitchell/Paul Brittain has some loppers that could possibly do the job)

Kay - new bench (KM) c/f

- Toilet Refurbishment completed
- Lighting in the Bar area completed (Cost £959.00)
- Lobby Floor completed (Cost £875.00)
- Finance

Our current total is £17,544.97

i) Tim outlined the increase in energy costs, with the latest gas bill for December reaching £700. Tim has sent an email to Hall users to request they are mindful of the thermostat and that they try and save energy.

We have a new fixed energy contract with SSE – Tim believes they are possibly charging more per unit and there are may be some meter-

reading issues - as a charity we should be paying 5% VAT and we're currently paying 25%.

Tim is following this up with SSE and will refer to the Ombudsman if necessary

ACRE use a different broker. Tim is attending a Web Meeting shortly to learn from other Village Halls how they are managing their energy costs.

ii) Tim raised the question about raising hire charges for 2023. Our last increase was 2015.

Many local venues have already raised their fees to cover rising energy costs. Tim put forward the proposal that we increase by 20%.

(Regular users get a 30% discount)

Proposal to start any increase from March/April – the beginning of the financial year.

Action: Tim to inform our regular Hall users regarding this suggestion and gather their views.

iii)Tim is looking into a Smart App (Hive) which will allow us to control the heating from an App, e.g. setting the heating to come on half an hour before/after a session. There was discussion about how flexible this could be, for example, if there are changes in temperature that can't be altered-too hot/too cold, however there was general agreement that this needs further exploration. **Action TS**A drastic option may be to close the Hall during winter months.
Committee felt this wasn't an option (for now) as the Hall is an important resource for many users.

Tim reminded members that if bills continue at this rate, we will have no funds for improvements and may be unable to meet our bills. iv) As there is no heating in the Archive Room (who meet weekly for two hours) a fan heater will be provided - **Action AM**

 Noticeboard for Tradespeople – at this point it was felt we couldn't progress with this as we have only used Willy Boyd so far!

Staging and Storage Options – LF-GELT/H&S

Louisa reported that she has not had the opportunity to follow this up. She is hoping to start enquiries after February Half Term. This has been an outstanding agenda item since November 2021. Kay put forward the suggestion that we contact some staging providers to ask them to provide a demonstration and a quote.

KM to contact Stack-a-Stage

Details of Mark Howson's suggested provider also to be invited to give a demo.

Stage blocks are still stacked outside. Louisa reiterated these cannot be relocated as she has no transport or storage space. Louisa advised that GELT has installed a long black drape at the rear of the stage, attached onto a batton. A query was raised how this might affect groups who use the projector

3. Fund Raising 2023

Discussion followed about how this might link with the proposed relaunch of the Christmas Tree Festival
